When I was a secondary school student, I couldn't stand on a particular school rule. My school used to ban chewing gums and I totally disagreed with it. Students were not allowed to chew gums anywhere in school, and we couldn't even have one.

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Obviously this rule was made because lots of students used to chew gums in schools, especially in classes, and left rubbish everywhere, so headmistress and teachers decided to ban gums in school.

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The result of breaking this rule was quite horrible; we got 1 hour detention after school. Everyone hated detention and sometimes when deputy headmaster was in charge for detention, we had to write an apology letter to teachers.

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I think it was the weirdest school rule that I've ever experienced. Teachers didn't really care about what we eat for snacks, but they particularly disliked students chewing gums in school.
