1) Easier way to examine a candidate

2) Shows attitudes of candidates

The academic transcript reflects the candidates' studying attitude and the willingness of learning.

Employers may consider that employees who achieved outstanding academic results tend to perform better than others.

- **Positive development**

Considering education backgrounds of candidates is still important as it means that they have learnt relevant theories and knowledge, useful skills, and spent a lot of time on researching their own works. It gives employers ideas what kind of person candidates are, what kind of knowledge they have obtained, and whether they have worked hard or not.

- **Negative development**

There are many things which people can only learn through experiences. Employees learn how to cooperate with others at work, how to handle their tasks within given period, and so on. It is unfair to examine an employee only by considering their academic qualifications.
