- No usually write e-mails


These days, not really. Sometimes when I travel abroad, I send postcards to my friends, but I don't write letters anymore.

Not very likely. Letters are already being replaced by e-mails and online communication, and not many people write letters. I don't think this tendency will be changed in the future.





### Part 2 – a magazine


### Magazine types;

- Professional magazines which contain contents for very niche groups of people, such as doctors, bankers or marketers

I'd like to talk about National Geographic, which is my favourite magazine. I've been subscribing it since I was 18 years old, and I still love this one.




## Part 2 sample answer

I love this magazine since I like reading about different cultures and wildlife. It's really interesting to read such articles, and I get to know about lots of issues around the world by reading the magazine.




Also I like photos in the magazine. Every photo is very high in quality, and I'm sure all these photos make audiences to think about particular issues. I think I'll keep reading it in the future.
